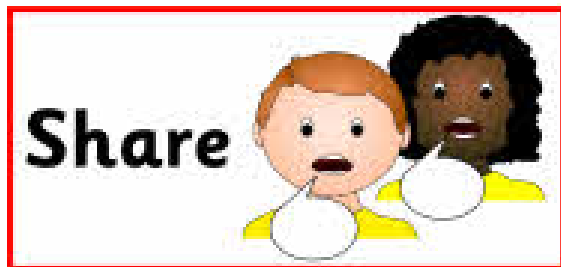
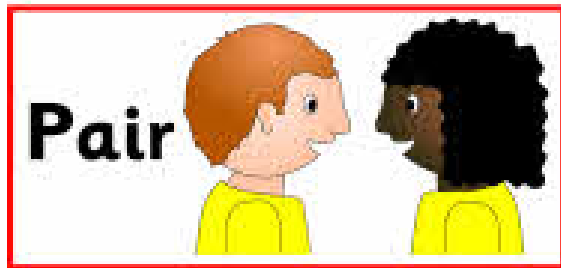
By developing No Hands Up strategies in the classroom it has enabled all students to be constantly focusing on the tasks in hand. Students are unable to switch off even for a moment as they are likely to be asked a question at any point in the lesson linked to the content, subject or conversation that has taken place. This allows students to be deeper thinkers as they are constantly processing information and having to consider solutions to problems that may arise throughout the lesson.

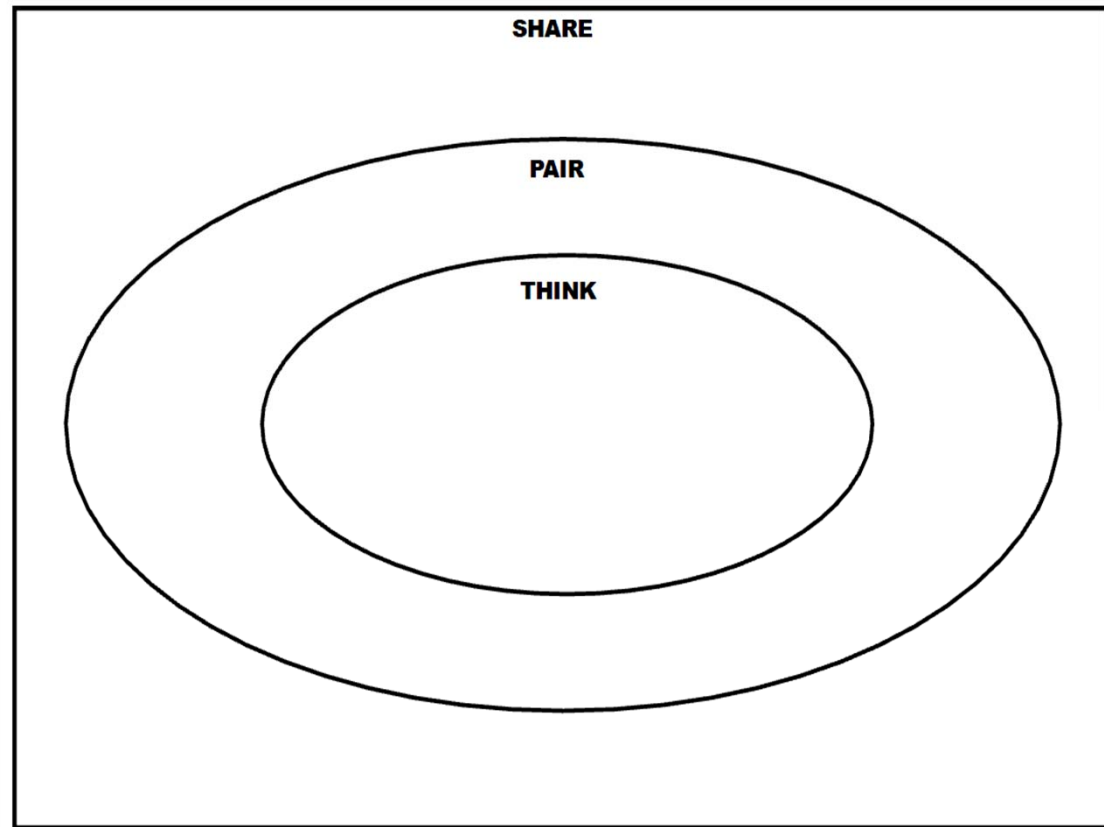


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Think, pair and share prompt cards



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No hands up has stopped the frustrating student bidding process I see in so many classrooms. The NHU approach has led to a more focused approach towards the anticipated learning as learners cannot afford to switch off at any point for fear of being caught out.

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I have produced Q Cards to embed NHU in the classroom. Students are only allowed to ask three questions each lesson and each time they do so a 'Q' is ticked off. Students are far more considered in which questions they answer and this then supports the NHU approach as they go to another source in the room to find the answer/ask the question/share the answer.

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'The best thing about the no hands up rule is that it ensures that pupils must remain 'on the ball' the whole way throughout the lesson; they are not allowed to take a back seat. In this way, they develop independence by personally engaging with the learning and providing their own answers rather than parroting those of their more enthusiastic peers.'

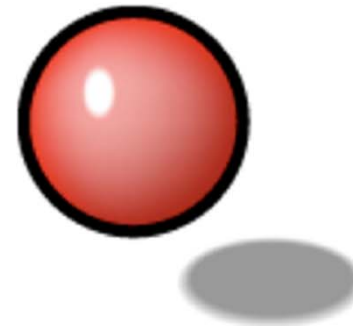

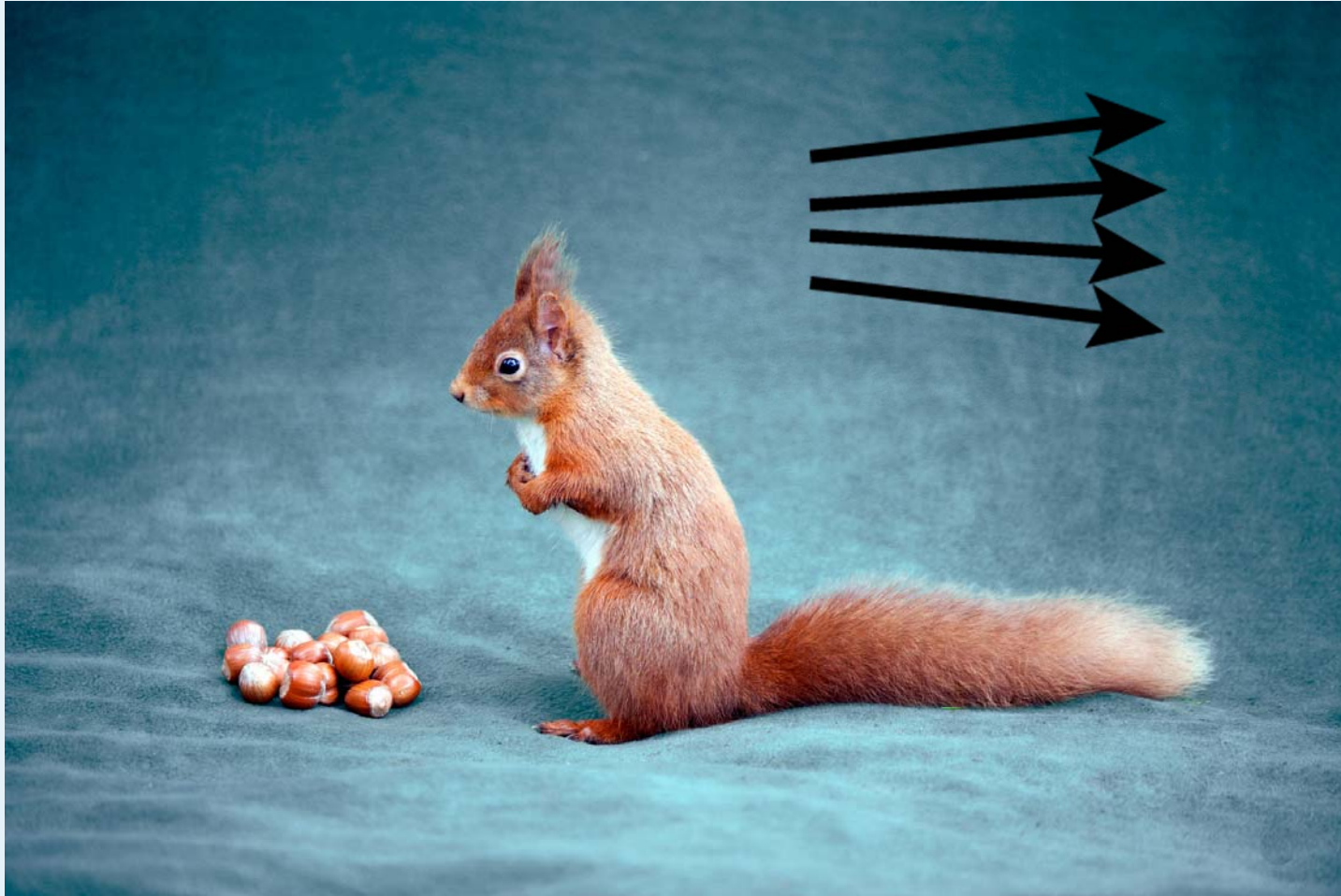

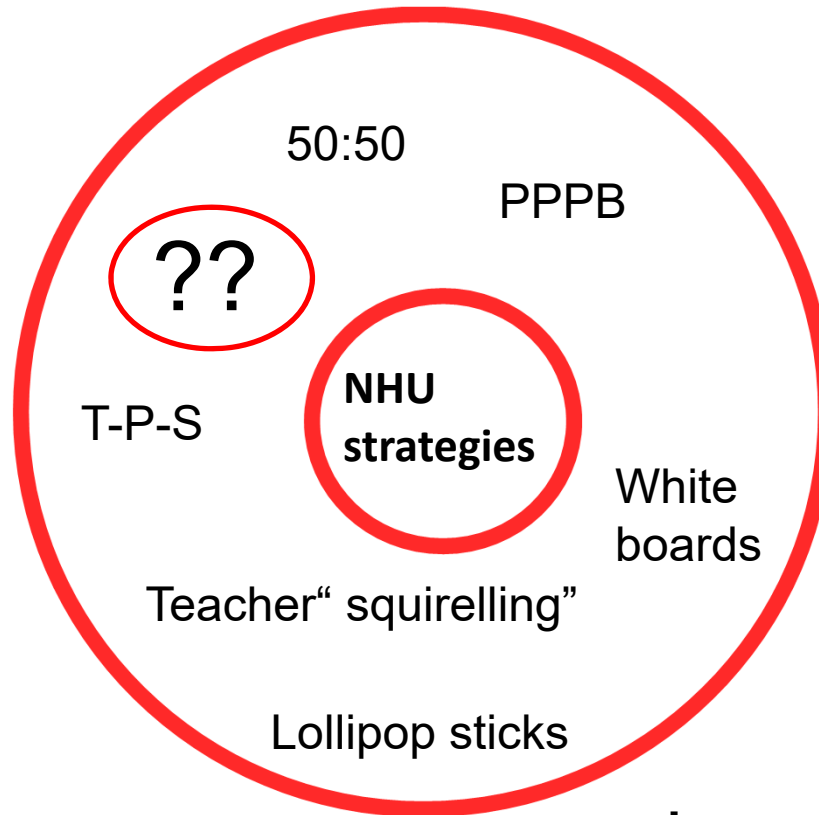
